
Summer Reading: 6th grade (6eme) Group 1

You should also include the title and the author's name. Please make your poster colorful and interesting to look at since we will hang some of the posters up to enjoy during the year.

You will be expected to discuss the book during the first week of school so if you read the book at the beginning of summer, review it quickly in August. This book takes place in colonial America, which you will be studying in history, so pay attention to details about how people lived in 1607.
